Self-monitoring reflects a person's ability to adjust his or her behavior to external, situational factors, which can be perceived e.g. by high self-monitoring individuals, who may tend to behave differently in different situations. There is also evidence that high self-monitors are closely attuned to the behavior of others and conform more readily than do low self-monitors. Thus they may be especially good at changing their leadership behavior.

Task activities are the various things members do that directly contribute to the performance of important group tasks. If tasks activities are not adequate, the group will have difficulty accomplishing its objectives. In an effective group, by contrast, members contribute important task activities as needed and as building blocks for performance success. Whereas task activities directly advance the performance agenda, maintenance activities support relationships among members.
