Fares

- **Student discounted season tickets** (only if you are less than 26 years old)

Available **once you register at Charles University and get your CU Student Card**, which you will use as your travel pass and to prove your student status. For the **fares** see www.dpp.cz/en/fares/fare-pricelist#1-3.

- **Full price season tickets** (26 years old and more)

It can be bought straight away upon your arrival at the Prague Transportation Company [DPP Information Centres](#) as well as [the DPP ticket sale points](#) (located at the metro and the airport) upon arranging for the so called PID ID travel pass there (you will need your ID and passport-size photo). - **Single tickets**

Before you arrange for a season ticket, you are expected to use **single tickets**, which are valid on all the metro, trams and buses with a possibility to change. They are available either at ticket machines in the metro and at some of the bus and tram stops or at newsstands as well as DPP Information Centres. **In order to make them valid, you must date-stamp the ticket** after boarding a bus, tram, or upon entering the metro.

- CZK 30 (valid for 30 minutes)
- CZK 40 (valid for 90 minutes)
- you need a special extra ticket for a larger luggage: CZK 16
- there are also some day tickets available: CZK 120 (24 hours) and CZK 330 (72 hours)
