Erasmus+

ERASMUS is the largest mobility program offered at Charles University. Each year, approximately 1,300 CU students are sent to over 800 partner universities. Since its establishment in 1987, Erasmus has facilitated the exchange of more than 4 million students.

Within the Erasmus+ program, **full degree students can participate on** <u>study stays</u>, <u>traineeships</u>, <u>traineeships for graduates</u> or <u>short-term doctoral mobilities</u>. You can find detailed information and deadlines on the respective links. Who is eligible?

- Students of BA, MA or PhD study programmes
- · Students in a full-time or distant form of studies
- · Students of any age or nationality
- In which year can I go on Erasmus+?
 - BA students: No earlier than the summer semester of the 2nd year and no later than the 4th year (we recommend applying in the February selection process!).
 - MA students: No earlier than the winter semester of the 2nd year and no later than the 3rd year.
 - PhD students: No earlier than the summer semester of the 1st year and no later than the 4th year.

- We strongly discourage mobilities to countries where the student has permanent residence or holds citizenship.
- In the additional selection process, the list of partner universities is limited!

Frasmus+ Grant

Differentiation of the grant for study and traineeship placements for the academic year of 2024/25 can be found $\underline{\text{here}}$.

The grant amount for **Great Britain** is 660 EUR per month for study placements and 810 EUR per month for traineeship placements.

NOTICE

If you are **not an EU resident**, make sure that you **fulfill all the visa requirements before** you go abroad. Simultaneously, you might pay extra for visa fees, health insurance etc., so make sure that you have sufficient funds to cover **all of your expenses** (abroad as well as upon your return). There are no additional grants that you are eligible for and **you won't be excused from paying the tuition fees here at the Faculty**. Most of the Erasmus countries are more expensive than the Czech Republic and as the Erasmus grant is not designed for covering all of your expenses, **we advise you to have sufficient savings**.
