
Master's Programmes



Faculty of Humanities offers **four Master's study programmes** in English or German:

1. Gender Studies
(taught in **English**, final application deadline **April 30**)
2. Oral History and Contemporary History
(taught in **English**, final application deadline **April 30**)
3. Historical Sociology
(taught in **English**, final application deadline **April 30**)
4. Deutsche und französische Philosophie
(taught in **German**, final application deadline: **July 31**)

Admission Process

The admission process at our Faculty consists of **two main steps**:

- Completing the admission requirements specific to your chosen programme(s)
This entails the submission of relevant documents. For admission requirements, please visit [programme-specific pages](#).
- Providing proof of previous study

All programmes require that you submit a certificate of previous study. This means that you have to provide your Bachelor's degree certificate if you want to apply to one of our Master's programmes.

Applicants with a disability, such as a specific learning difficulty, can request that the admission process be specially adapted to meet their needs. In this case a medical report must be included in the application form.

Application Form and Deadline

Applications are accepted **on a rolling basis** with a **final deadline** of **April 30, 2021**, or **July 31, 2021**, depending on the study programme. **Applications open in November**. Application form is available [via our Admissions portal](#) (programmes taught in English) and [here](#) (programme Deutsche und französische Philosophie).

Admission Information

The deadline for applicants to submit proof of previous study is **September 30, 2021**. Please, be aware that the process of recognition/nostrification takes some time - up to 1 month for recognition and up to 3 months for nostrification. When planning your enrolment and studies, keep in mind that you should submit all the relevant documents sufficiently in advance.

Applicants who are unable to get their foreign diploma recognised/nostrified until the end of September are allowed to submit a copy of their BA diploma **no later than October 22, 2021**. This is the **extended and final deadline** for enrolment in the academic year 2021/2022. Please, keep in mind that the academic year already starts in the beginning October.

Recognition of Foreign Diplomas and Degrees

Without having finished the nostrification/recognition process, you cannot be enrolled in the study if you have received an education certificate outside of the Czech Republic. You can start the process once you receive confirmation that you have been accepted to your chosen programme. During this process, please, take into consideration the approximate length of each individual procedure.

To begin, you will need your BA diploma together with the attachments you received with it, e.g. diploma transcript. You will not be using the original documents but verified copies of the original. Those copies should be certified either through an [apostille](#) (in case you are from one of the states that signed the Apostille convention) or [super-legalization](#). Please, bear in mind that only copies in English or Czech language will be accepted for this process.
